CINCINNATI SHETLAND SHEEPDOG CLUB

Rick Foreman

January 6, 1947 - October 2, 2024

Together with Ozzie, his wife of 52 years, Rick was a fixture at Southern Ohio dog shows for many years. He was a congenial worker, holding just about every volunteer job imaginable. He was Clermont County Kennel club treasurer and a board member for several years, assisted with show and trial set up and tear down, helped usher in CCKC agility trials, stewarded conformation shows and obedience and rally trials, did ring hospitality for judges and stewards, and more. He and Ozzie were also active members of Queen City Dog Training Club and after their first Sheltie joined their family, they joined the Cincinnati Shetland Sheepdog Club to help support their new breed.

When anti-breeding activists began efforts to restrict Ohio dog breeding in the 1990s, Rick became a founding member of Ohio Valley Dog Owners, a group of area breeders, clubs, and exhibitors that monitored anti-breeding ordinances and regulations and testified against restrictive dog laws introduced at the Ohio House and Senate. As an owner of American Staffordshire Terriers, his special expertise was breed specific state legislation and local breed restrictions and he testified against those restrictions at local meetings and the state legislature.



A voracious reader of anything about dogs and dog training, Rick especially loved the character and special abilities of purebred dogs. Over the years, he and Ozzie owned other breeds, including Newfoundlands, Shelties, an American Hairless Terrier, and a Rat Terrier. They showed each breed in conformation and obedience, proved the ability of their Newfs to carry out the breed's traditional roles in carting and water rescue work, and embraced rally, agility, and scent work with each of their dogs as AKC added these sports.

Over the years, Rick and Ozzie traveled by camper to 48 states with their dogs and to Hawaii and Alaska on their own. In 1997 they joined the Great Newfoundland Dog Trek across Canada to participate in the 500th anniversary celebration of the voyage of explorer John Cabot from Britain to the province of Newfoundland. Rick's Redi was the only brown dog among the 130 Newfs that honored Queen Elizabeth, Prince Philip, and other dignitaries who attended the celebration, and Rick never tired of telling people that the Queen briefly acknowledged Redi as the only brown dog on the procession path.

Rick had a smile for everyone, a quiet sense of humor, and a willing heart. He is missed.

Attention Exhibitors

- **PARKING:** There is ample free car parking available. There is also NO reserved parking. If you place cones or other objects to reserve parking spaces, they will be picked up and may be retrieved at the WCKC table for a \$25 fee.
- The Show Site will be available to exhibitors at 7am on Friday, March 28, 2025. Dogs must be removed from the Show Site immediately following Best in Show judging, Sunday, March 30, 2025.
- **Royal Canin Ring** will be locked from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily.
- **Dogs may not be left overnight. (violators will be subject to a disciplinary committee)**
- Grooming in designated areas only!
- **Day Grooming** - ALL items must be removed by end of Best in Show. Any items left in day grooming will be removed by host club and owners will be charged \$25 reserved grooming fee payable in cash prior to return of items.
- No gasoline or diesel generators permitted within 100 ft. of any building in which the show is conducted.
- Use of private exercise pens is not permitted inside the building and are strongly discouraged around the building perimeter.
- Inside crating in designated areas only. Crates should be stacked. No soft-sided crates permitted.
- **No crates permitted ring side except during judging only.**
- Dogs must be on leash except when crated or as required for judging.
- All trophies must be claimed the day of the show. None will be mailed. Trophies not claimed will become the property of the show-giving club. The Club reserves the right to substitute a trophy of equal or greater value.
- **All exhibitors must clean up after their dogs - outside, inside and in the ring! (violators will be subject to a disciplinary committee)**

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS • ROYAL CANIN RING & HOTEL RULES

1. No exercise pens allowed in front of Royal Canin Ring or Hotel. Exercise pens around the perimeter of the entire building are strongly discouraged.
2. No exercise or potty pens permitted inside Royal Canin Ring.
3. No soft crates are permitted inside Royal Canin Ring.
4. No crates permitted ringside except during judging and shortly before and after.
5. Marked crating areas MUST be observed.
6. Crates should be stacked.
7. All dogs are required to be on-leash at Royal Canin Ring and Hotel at all times (except when crated or as required to be judged).
8. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult when on show grounds.
9. Building will be locked from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. each day. **NO DOGS TO BE LEFT IN BUILDING OVERNIGHT.**

- The show giving club, the Superintendent, their agents, employees, etc., assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers to any of their dogs or property, and further assume no responsibility for injury to children.

PUBLICATION RIGHTS: By entering this show, all owners, handlers, breeders and kennels agree that all rights to televise, videotape, photograph, advertise, promote and publicize or otherwise exploit this show, or the persons or animals participating in it or the results of the competition before, during or after the event, shall belong solely to The American Kennel Club and their respective assigns, including the use of the names, likenesses or biographical matter of all dogs, owners, handlers, breeders and kennels participating in the show and no such owner, handler, breeder or kennel shall allow any other party to make commercial use of any videotape or photograph of any person or animal participating in this competition.

The Club and its Superintendent caution all persons entering the show site and show grounds against all hazards which may exist, including, but not limited to: Condition of the site/grounds, parking/loading/ unloading areas, entrances, floors and stairways, elevators and escalators, floor coverings, walkways, tenting/canopies, electrical appliances, cords and fittings, exercise pens, and the presence of animals.

All persons should take into consideration this is a sporting event and dress, act and exercise caution appropriate for the activity involved.

All persons entering the show, the grounds, site and show areas for whatever purpose do so entirely at their own risk. By virtue of entering the show, the entrant has indicated their acceptance of the terms listed in the premium list and assumes all risks involved.

NO PRACTICING ALLOWED IN RINGS AT ANY TIME. Dogs may Arrive any time prior to their scheduled time of judging. Dogs not required for further judging will be excused. Judges will not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging ring when their classes are called to be judged. All Dogs Present must be held on leash or confined to their crates except when being judged or when in the exercising ring.

No gasoline or diesel generators are permitted inside any building or within 100 feet of any tent in which this dog show is conducted.

As specified in Chapter 12, Section 4 of the AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows, information contained on the entry form is required to be published in the club's show catalog. This information is also subject to publication in other media.

Entry Fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the event's Show Committee. If because of riots, wars, strikes, civil disturbances, national emergencies, health emergencies, and the dictates of law enforcement or of the owner(s) of the grounds and/or facilities or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entry fee will be made. Extreme weather conditions, such as, but not limited to, snow storms, hurricanes, lightning, extreme heat, heavy rains, or other circumstances including, but not limited to, the condition of the facilities or grounds and/or the ingress and egress from the grounds, must be considered for the health and safety of the dogs, exhibitors and spectators. The well-being of dogs, exhibitors and spectators is of paramount importance and, in the event it is necessary to cancel or stop the show before completion, no refund of entry fee will be made.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
