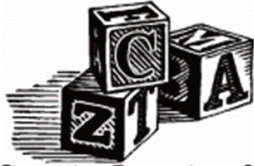

Dog Days of Summer Cluster Rules

- No outside food or beverages may be brought into the Batesville Civic Center building, except items for babies. Of course, bait, food and water for dogs are permitted.
- No smoking in the building, covered arenas, dog bathing area.
- Leave flashers on while loading or unloading. No parking is allowed in the loading and unloading areas. **10 minute unloading strictly enforced. Exhibitors with small dogs and/or small amounts of loading equipment are encouraged to use the ramps at the East and West entrances (front & back of the civic center). Proceed from the entrances to the elevator at the southwest corner to go to the lower level for reserved grooming.**
- All RV's must park in the designated RV parking areas in the South Parking lot only.
- No parking on the grass
- RV Parking Lots are in the south parking lot only.
The show grounds for RV parking will be available until after **12:00 PM on Tuesday**. If you are arriving in the Batesville area prior to this date, you are directed to go to **John Kyle State Campground**, 27550 MS-315, Sardis, MS 38666, 662-563-4936. Another wonderful option for RV's is the **Roundabout Campground** (16 mile from Civic Center), 750 Hwy 6 West, Oxford MS Phone 662-371-0496. Roundabout Campground is a new luxury campground. Check their website at <https://www.roundaboutoxford.com/>
- Building will be available on **Wednesday at 2:00 PM, or after setup is complete**. For safety reasons no one, except for club members, vendors and Cluster staff, is permitted to bring equipment or dogs into the building until setup is complete.
- No saving of space for others is permitted. The Event committee will monitor excessive use of space in order to provide a good experience for all exhibitors.
- Building will be open at **6:00 AM** prior to the events and will be locked at **10:00 PM** on Wednesday through Saturday nights.
- Grooming is permitted only in designated areas. Observe all aisles as marked and keep them clear.
- **Mats or tarps are not allowed on the concrete in crating areas, except a stress-relief mat at each grooming table.**
- For the convenience of exhibitors, crates and tables are allowed close to the conformation rings in designated staging areas 15 minutes before and after scheduled ring times and during the judging or for photographs.
- Dogs may be left in the building overnight on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. All owners or handlers leaving dogs overnight in the building **MUST** leave a clearly visible card with emergency cell-phone contact information near the crated dogs. A guard will patrol the building and the RV parking lots throughout the night. However, the Cluster members assume **NO** liability for any animals or equipment left in the building overnight.
- Any dog displaying signs of illness (e.g., excessive coughing) will not be allowed in the building.
- Exhibitors are expected to observe all posted signs and to clean up after their dogs both inside and outside the building. Plenty of trash cans and waste buckets are distributed throughout the site. Please immediately notify a member of the Event Committee or a member of the Custodial Crew, if liquids need mopping.
- Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining clean conditions in and around their setups.
- No private exercise pens in the building or in the North Parking Lot.
- Shavings or other comparable materials used in private exercise pens in the parking lots must be swept up, bagged and deposited in a dumpster prior to the individual's leaving the show. NO shavings or other comparable material may be placed on grass or dirt.
- Dogs must be removed from the building by **6:00 PM on Sunday night**.
- See additional rules and notices under **ATTENTION EXHIBITORS and Special Instructions**.

Please leave grounds in the condition that you found them. Place all trash in bags and deposit in the trash containers before leaving. The Batesville Civic Center provides an exceptional site for dog shows and we want to be able to continue using it in the future.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

The Show Site will be available to exhibitors at **2:00 pm on Wednesday, or after setup is complete**. The show building will open for vendors at **9:00 am on Wednesday**, vendors should consult their contracts regarding specific move-in instructions and times. Dogs must be removed from the show site immediately following Best in Show judging on Sunday.

All vehicles must be removed from the parking areas by **10:00 pm, Sunday**, unless special arrangements are made for RV parking overnight on Sunday.

An elevator is located at the southwest corner arena. Access to and from the arena floor is marked with signs.

Dogs may be left in the building overnight. The security guard will be present in the building and will patrol the RV Parking area throughout the night. Exhibitors **MUST** leave a 3x5 Inch card with an emergency contact (cell) phone number prominently displayed near the dogs crated overnight. Building will be opened at **6:00 am** prior to events and will be closed at **10:00 pm** on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday & Saturday nights. Dogs must be removed from the building by **6:00 pm on Sunday**.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

GROOMING will be in designated areas. No grooming will be allowed in any other areas of the buildings except the designated areas. All crates must be stacked. No private exercise pens in the building or in the North Parking Lot. Areas near and between the conformation rings are for temporary crating only.

The Show Committee will tour grooming areas each morning and inspect crates. Any owner whose crates are soiled is subject to an Event Committee Hearing if not cleaned and taken care of immediately.

No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the premises.

Exhibitors should have a copy of their proof of rabies vaccination available upon request.

Dogs may not be left unattended in vehicles, unless the vehicle is specially-equipped with adequate air-conditioning (e.g., motorhomes and recreation vehicles).

All persons attending this Cluster hereby waive any claim for damages against Greater Shelby Kennel Club, the Kennel Club of North Mississippi and the Memphis Toy Dog Club or their members in the event a motor vehicle must be entered to rescue a dog from overheating or suffocation due to improper ventilation.

All driveways must be kept open for access by emergency vehicles.

Mats or tarps are not allowed on the concrete except a small stress-relief pad at each grooming table.

No baby strollers allowed in the building.

There will be no charge for exhibitor parking. Security will be provided overnight for RV parking.



AKC® Code of Sportsmanship and Civility

Preface: The tradition of competitive purebred dog events predates 1884—the year the American Kennel Club (AKC®) was founded. Those involved in these sports share core values, including a strong commitment to sportsmanship and a welcoming, respectful culture that embraces the diverse community united by a love of dogs.

These values are evident across all aspects of the sport: conformation, performance, companion, and family dog activities. Many believe that the enduring principles of sportsmanship and civility are key reasons the sport has thrived for over 140 years.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.
