AKC® Code of Sportsmanship and Civility

Preface: The tradition of competitive purebred dog events predates 1884—the year the American Kennel Club (AKC®) was founded. Those involved in these sports share core values, including a strong commitment to sportsmanship and a welcoming, respectful culture that embraces the diverse community united by a love of dogs.

These values are evident across all aspects of the sport: conformation, performance, companion, and family dog activities. Many believe that the enduring principles of sportsmanship and civility are key reasons the sport has thrived for over 140 years.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.

BUILDING & GROOMING AREA NOT AVAILABLE BEFORE 12:00 P.M. ON WEDNESDAY. EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO SHOW THEIR SHOW I.D. TO ENTER THE EVENT. NO ADMITTANCE WITHOUT IT EACH DAY. RESERVED GROOMING AREA WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR DOGS OVERNIGHT, BUT BUILDING WILL BE LOCKED.

Notice to Exhibitors & Vendors

The clubs will be in compliance with COVID-19 safety precautions in place at the time of the event.

Depending on the conditions and circumstances at the time of the shows, we may choose to eliminate Special Attractions and any other events the clubs deem necessary. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding. By entering these shows you agree to do your best to follow all "best practices" in effect during the cluster and that you will not hold either Club, or The South Florida Fair Grounds liable for any condition that might arise while you are in attendance.

Camping will be permitted at the Fairgrounds and will be available to campers starting **Tuesday, March 17**. Full hookups (*water, sewer and electric*) are available for **\$70.00 per night**. The South Florida Fairgrounds has a limited number of camping spaces for these events. **The on site spots are FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED. ONLY handicapped persons or vehicles** will be allowed access through gate 10. This is the area back of the west expo across from stockade. Handicapped mirror tag, identification card or license plate are required. **Each camping space has electric, water and sewer hookups. Campers must bring their own cords and connections. Please check in with security for your space assignment. X-pens must be set up within your site. All RV parking is handled by the South Florida Fairgrounds and you must follow their rules.**

Day of event parking: \$10.00 Enter Gate 12.

General Admittance Fee: \$10.00 for non-exhibitors. Children under 12 enter at no charge.

No crates allowed near rings except during judging of your breed. Do not block aisles. This will be enforced by the Event Committee. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

No X-Pens allowed in grooming area.

No Grooming Tables allowed inside except for grooming area.

Grooming Areas must be Kept Clean. **NO SAVING SPACES. NO TAPING OFF SPACE.**

Outside exercise areas: Dogs should be exercised before coming into event buildings. **PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG.**

Absolutely No Smoking in Buildings.

No dogs permitted in any restroom! No cleaning of dog food bowls in restrooms.

Dogs must be kept out of all flower beds and posted areas.

Violators will be brought before an Event Committee.

The show-giving clubs, the show superintendent, their agents, employees, etc. assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, spectators, handlers or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children, or to dogs left overnight in building.

These Clubs are not responsible for the products or actions of Vendors at these shows.

The Clubs and their Superintendent caution all persons entering the show site and show grounds against all hazards which may exist, including, but not limited to: Conditions of the site/grounds, parking/loading/unloading areas, entrances, floors and stairways, elevators and escalators, floor coverings, walkways, tenting/canopies, electrical appliances, cords and fittings, exercise pens, and the presence of animals. All persons should take into consideration this is a sporting event and dress, act and exercise caution appropriate for the activity involved. All persons entering the show grounds, site and show areas for whatever purpose do so entirely at their own risk. By virtue of entering the show, the entrant has indicated their acceptance of the terms listed in this premium list and assumes all risks involved.

NO UNENTERED DOGS ALLOWED ON GROUNDS UNLESS IT IS A SERVICE DOG

Attention Owners/Exhibitors of Foreign Registered Dogs

If you are the owner/exhibitor of a dog registered with a foreign registry (*not yet dual registered with AKC*) please review the eligibility requirements in The Rules Applying to Dog Shows, chapter 11 section 1.

The Dog show rules are posted on the AKC Web Site at <http://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/RREGS3.pdf>.

Most important to note are the following:

1. Dogs must be individually registered with the American Kennel Club by the day of the event to be eligible for exhibit in the Bred by Exhibitor class.
2. Dogs are eligible to compete in AKC events using the foreign registration for a period of 30 days. That 30-day period begins with the date of first exhibit, regardless of whether the dog earned any points or awards. To continue to compete in AKC events beyond the initial 30-day period the dog must be either individually AKC registered or by the date of the event have been granted an extension to exhibit using the foreign registration.
