JUDGES AWARD OF MERIT

Awards of Merit will be awarded after Best of Breed judging is completed, to Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retrievers in Best of Breed competition that exemplify the breed's characteristics. These awards are reserved for those quality animals the judge feels are worthy of final consideration for Best of Breed. The dogs selected for Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed are not eligible for an Award of Merit. At judges discretion, up to four (4) awards will be awarded in the Best of Breed competition, which shall include move-ups, Winners Dog, Winners Bitch, first place in Veteran Dog Class, and Veteran Bitch Class.

Best Puppy in the Regular Puppy Classes

The First Place Winners from the individual Regular Puppy Classes (6-9 mos. And 9-12 mos.) will compete for the award of Best Puppy in the Regular Classes. Best Puppy competition will follow Best of Breed judging.

Best Bred-By-Exhibitor in the Bred-By-Exhibitor Classes

The First Place Winners from the individual Bred-By-Exhibitor Classes will compete for the award of Best Bred-By-Exhibitor. Best Bred-By-Exhibitor competition will follow Best of Breed judging.

Best Veteran in the Veteran Classes

The First Place Winners from the Veteran Classes will compete for the award of Best Veteran. Best Veteran competition will follow Best of Breed judging.

Best Hunting Retriever in the Hunting Retriever Classes

The First Place Winners from the Hunting Retriever Classes will compete for the award of Best Hunting Retriever. Best Hunting Retriever competition will follow Best of Breed judging.

Best Working Retriever in the Working Retriever Classes

The First Place Winners from the Working Retriever Classes will compete for the award of Best Working Retriever. Best Working Retriever competition will follow Best of Breed judging.

NON-REGULAR (ADDITIONAL) CLASSES INVOLVING SINGLE DOG ENTRIES

Veterans 7-10 Class – Class for dogs and class for bitches seven (7) to ten (10) years of age or older.

Veterans 10 & Older Class— Class for dogs and class for bitches Ten (10) year of age and older.

Veterans Note: 1st place winners of Veteran Dog & Veteran Bitch classes are eligible to compete for Best of Breed if undefeated in any other classes at this show. Ribbon prizes will be awarded for first through fourth place. Neutered Dogs and Spayed Bitches may be entered.

Hunting Retriever Class— A Class for Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Dogs/Bitches that have a Working Certificate Excellent (WCX) from the NSDTRC(USA) or an AKC Senior Hunter title (SH) or Master Hunter title (MH) . This is a single dog entry class, eligible for Best of Breed (if otherwise undefeated). Dogs must be intact– no spayed or neutered dogs are allowed. The Hunting Retriever class shall be divided by sex.

Working Retriever Class— A Class for Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Dogs/Bitches that have a Working Certificate (WC), Working Certificate Intermediate (WCI) or an AKC Junior Hunter Title (JH). This is a single dog entry class, eligible for Best of Breed (if otherwise undefeated). Dogs must be intact– no spayed or neutered dogs are allowed.

The Working Retriever class shall be divided by sex, and is for any dog that has earned an NSDTRC (USA) WC or WCI, or AKC JH title or higher. Dogs eligible to enter the Hunting Retriever Class may also enter the Working Retriever Class. The winners of Working Retriever Dog, Working Retriever Bitch, Hunting Retriever Dog and Hunting Retriever Bitch classes would all go on to compete for Best of Breed if still undefeated, similar to the way the veterans class is split by age.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES

As the judge's decision in the Non-Regular Classes involving Multiple Dog Entries is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes.

STUD DOG CLASS – For Stud Dog and a minimum of two (2); maximum of four (4) of their Get. It is not necessary that the Get be under the same ownership as that of the Stud Dog. The Stud Dog may be entered separately in one of the regular classes, or if a Champion of Record in Best of Breed Competition, but **MUST** be entered in the Stud Dog Class, the Get **MUST** be entered in one of the regular classes. The Stud Dog shall be considered as one entry and requires one entry fee, this being the regular fee plus the additional class fee if the Stud Dog is entered in another class. The Stud Dog must be shown in the ring with the Get. The class will be judged on the merits of the Get. Note – Chapter 11, Section 8, of the AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows, provides that neutered dogs may be entered as the Stud Dog.

BROOD BITCH CLASS – Same as for the Stud Dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

Novice Junior 9 & under 12 yrs • Open Junior 9 & under 12 yrs
Novice Intermediate 12 & under 15 yrs • Open Intermediate 12 & under 15 yrs
Novice Senior 15 & under 18 yrs • Open Senior 15 & under 18 yrs
Master Class

Novice Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition, if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open, after the closing of entries for a show are required to transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class by notifying the Superintendent or Show Secretary at least one-half hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show.

Open Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show.

Master Class - for boys & girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department (919) 233-9767.

Entry blank MUST be filled out with the necessary information; otherwise the entry in Junior Showmanship will not be accepted.

Best Junior Handler - To be selected from the winners of each Junior Showmanship class. Competition not required.

Reserve Best Junior Handler - After the judge has awarded the Best Junior Handler, the second place winner from the class that the Junior was awarded Best Junior Handler is to return to the ring to compete for Reserve Best Junior Handler.

Eligibility - For Tollers only. Each dog handled in a Junior Showmanship Class must be entered in one of the Breed classes at the show, or must be entered for Junior Showmanship only. Each dog must be owned or co-owned by the Junior Handler or by the Junior Handler's father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfather or grandmother, including step and half relations or by a permanent member of the Junior's household. Every dog entered for Junior Showmanship must be eligible to compete in Dog Shows or Obedience Trials. BITCHES IN SEASON ARE NOT ELIGIBLE.

Substitutions - A dog may be substituted. Such substitution must be accompanied by an official AKC entry form. All such substitutions must be made 1/2 hour prior to the judging of the Junior Showmanship classes at the show. All eligibility criteria above must be met. A Junior Handler is limited to one substitution per show. NOTE: Juniors who substitute for the original dog they have entered in Junior Showmanship classes with a dog that is not entered in the Specialty must remit the Junior Showmanship Only entry fee with their substitution.

Obedience & Rally

“Dog” means either sex. Transfers allowed per AKC regulations.

Qualifying Score Required For All Obedience & Rally Prizes

A Dark Green Rosette will be given for qualifying scores.

Entries in Classes requiring jumps MUST include the jump height on the entry form.

Obedience and Rally Classes requiring jumps will be judged in Ascending height order beginning at 4”

REFUNDS: Bitches in Season: Refund of entry will be made for Bitches entered in Obedience and Rally Classes who come in season after entries close. Request in writing must be submitted to the Superintendent with certificate from a Veterinarian no later than 30 Minutes before regular class judging of that trial.

Veterans Class. The Veterans Class will be for dogs that have an obedience title and are at least 7 years old on the date of the trial. The exercises will be performed and judged as in the Novice Class. Dogs may be entered in another class or classes.

Brace Class. The Brace Class will be for two dogs of the same breed that are eligible under these *Regulations* and capable of performing the Novice exercises. The dogs need not be owned by the same person but will be handled by one handler. Dogs may be shown unattached or coupled (***the coupling device will not be less than 6 inches in overall length***). ***Whichever method is used will be continued throughout all exercises.*** Dogs may be handled by the owner or any other person, need not be entered in another class at the same trial, and need not have obedience titles. A separate official entry form will be completed in full for each dog entered.

*****Please identify which dogs are members of the brace on each entry form. If more than one brace designate “Brace 1”, “Brace 2”, etc. **For online entries, please use the “comments” section for this information.***

Team Class. The Team class will be for teams of any four dogs that are eligible under these regulations. Five dogs may be entered, one to be considered an alternate for which no entry fee will be required. However, the same four dogs will perform all exercises. Dogs may be handled by the owner or any other person, need not be entered in another class at the same trial, and need not have obedience titles. A separate official entry form will be completed in full for each dog entered. No dog may be entered on more than one team.

Compensation for expenses outside of the conformation ring does not meet this definition."

Distribution of Sweepstakes Prize Money

Hunting Retriever Sweepstakes Class must be indicated on the entry form.

Specialty Challenge Trophies

BEST VETERAN CHALLENGE TROPHY

This trophy is an etched image of a Toller coming out of the water with a retrieved duck. This trophy is offered in memory of Robert Hoch by Dee Nichols (KD's Kennels) and Laura White (Cinnstar Retrievers) for the Best Veteran at the NSDTRC (USA) National Specialty. This trophy is offered on a three-time win basis, and permanent possession of the trophy will be awarded permanently to any owner who wins the trophy three at three different National Specialty Shows, not necessarily with the same dog.

BEST PUPPY PERPETUAL TROPHY

The trophy is a two-tiered wood base of natural-color cherry wood. A crystal block with a 3-dimensional image of a Toller will adorn the top of the trophy. The crystal block will be illuminated from within the trophy with lighting. This trophy is offered by Jamie Como and Kathy Koebensky-Como for the Best Puppy at a NSDTRC (USA) National Specialty, after they have won Best Puppy three times at previous National Specialties to become permanent owners of the Sagewood Kennel Best Puppy Challenge Trophy. This trophy is offered on a three-time win basis, and permanent possession of the trophy will be awarded permanently to any owner who wins the trophy three times at three different National Specialty Shows, not necessarily with the same dog.

HIGH IN TRIAL OBEDIENCE CHALLENGE TROPHY

This trophy is a silver cup on a wooden base. This High in Trial trophy is offered by Lonetree Kennels through the NSDTRC (USA). This trophy is offered on a three-time win basis, and permanent possession of the trophy will be awarded permanently to any owner who wins the trophy three at three different National Specialty Shows, not necessarily with the same dog.

NSDTRC (USA) Special Awards

The following Awards are presented by the Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club (USA) through the generosity of members and friends. These awards are for achievements during the previous year(s) and are presented where appropriate at the Annual Awards Banquet.

2016/2017 Rusty Jones Award

Each year at the NSDTRC (USA) Annual Awards Banquet, the Club recognizes our most versatile dogs by presenting them with the Rusty Jones Award. The award is named after CH Sylvan's Rusty Jones CDX WC, one of our earliest versatile Tollers.

To be eligible, a dog must have earned an NSDTRC (USA) Championship, an NSDTRC (USA) or AKC Companion Dog title, and an NSDTRC (USA) Working Certificate. To receive the award this year, the last title must be completed by June 30, 2017.

No applications are necessary for this award. Awards will be given out at the 2017 Annual Awards Banquet.

Sylvan Kennel Award

Each year Lennoxlove Kennel gives the Sylvan Kennel Award to the Toller who has earned the highest average score of the first three qualifying scores towards an American Kennel Club obedience title. The Award for this year will go to the dog who earned the highest average score between July 1, 2016 and June 30, 2017. the recipient of the Award must be a member in good standing of the NSDTRC (USA).

Lennoxlove Kennel offers this Award as an encouragement to the membership of the NSDTRC (USA) to train their Tollers, enjoy working with them and to publicize to others the attributes of our breed.

Dogs in contention for the Award will be identified by our club Statistician and provide to Records, who will identify the winning dog. This information will be given to Marile Waterstraat of Lennoxlove Kennel, who will present the Award to the winning dog and handler at our 2017 Annual Awards Banquet.

Tenderfoot Obedience Award

Each year, Region II will give an Award to the highest scoring dog/handler team at the Annual Meeting and National Specialty show in the Novice A obedience class.

This award was originally conceived by Evelyn Williams as a way to encourage Toller owners to become involved with obedience competition with their dogs. Evelyn became involved in Tollers in 1989, and during her lifetime trained her Tollers to the highest level in obedience and in the field. Evelyn was a wonderful obedience trainer and handler, and was always in contention for HIT awards. Obedience was one of her favorite dog sports because of the teamwork involved, and because of the foundation it provides any future work in the field.

After the completion of the Novice A class, a representative from Region II will review each Toller's score entered in the class to determine the winner. The Tenderfoot Award will then be given out by a representative of Region II at the 2017 Annual Awards Banquet.

Evelyn A. Williams Award of Excellence

This award, given in memory of Evelyn A. Williams, is intended to inspire present and future owner/handlers of Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retrievers to pursue the highest levels of achievement in various venues available to the Toller. The award consists of the presentation of a Certificate of Excellence for each dog owner-handled to any of the levels defined and a lapel pin representing said achievement. An Honor Roll of Excellence is maintained, and each year, the recipients of the Evelyn A. Williams Award of Excellence are recognized in Quackers.

Recognizing that the Toller is a versatile breed and is seen participating in many venues, this award may be presented to those owner/handlers participating in and achieving the highest levels of recognition in any of these venues: Conformation, Obedience, Field Tests/Field Trials, Tracking, and Agility. Also recognizing that the membership of the Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club (USA) has member in several foreign countries, and members freely crossing the Canadian border to participate in these various venues, titles/achievements comparable to those listed below by recognized foreign and domestic registries and organizations as listed are eligible for this award. This is an award in recognition and in celebration of the outstanding achievements of the owner/handlers of Tollers.

Information and applications for this year's awards, for titles and achievements earned from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, are on the club's website (www.nsdtrc-usa.org) and must be submitted to Kim Simons by September 1, 2017. The awards will be given out at the Annual Awards Banquet.

Rising Star Award

Each year, in honor of CH RedDog's Rising Star, Sydney Jones presents the Rising Star Award to the owner of the brood bitch that produced the most AKC Champions over the course of the previous calendar year. This year's award will be for January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016 and is based on AKC and Pedigree statistics. No applications are necessary for this award. The Award will be given out at the Annual Awards Banquet.

Admiral Halsey HOT Dog Teamwork Award

This award is presented in memory MHR Westharbour's Admiral Halsey AKC/CKC MH, CDX, CKC CD, WCI for teamwork presented in the field venue. It will be given to the team of owner and dog who complete all their training and hunt tests together and achieved any AKC field title from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. Information and applications are on the club website (www.nsdtrc-usa.org) and are due by September 1, 2017. Awards will be presented at the Annual Awards Banquet.

Struan Award

This is a perpetual trophy to be awarded to the NSDTRC (USA) member-handler of the oldest dog of either sex to earn a Working Certificate Intermediate at a NSDTRC (USA) Hunt Test. To be eligible for the award, a dog must be five (5) years old or older on the day of the test and not have earned a title in any field testing program at a level that involves a double marked retrieve.

Meredith Noreen Memorial Award

In memory of Meredith Noreen, at the end of each calendar year, the Toller who achieves the #1 status in AKC Toller Breed Points and the one who achieves the #1 Toller in All-breed points shall receive a frameable certificate with the title Meredith Noreen Memorial Award.

Roy'll Flush Award

This Award is presented by Sue Dorscheid and Mike Elmergreen in honor of HRCH U-UD GRCH Can/Am/NSDTRC Ch Springvale's Roy'll Flush NSDTRC CDX Can CD Can/NSDTRC WCX MH. Roy was the first Toller to earn the AKC MH title and the first AKC CH/MH.

The Award will be given to any Toller that earns both an AKC MH title and an AKC CH title in which the owner has been a member in good standing for a minimum of one year. Titles do not have to be earned in the same year. In order to receive the Award at the 2017 Annual Banquet, both titles will have to have been completed by June 30, 2017. No applications are necessary for this Award. Dogs eligible will be identified by NSDTRC Records.

Eddy Advanced Versatility Award

This is an award to recognize the versatile abilities of Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retrievers competing and successfully earning the highest advanced level AKC Titles. To qualify, a dog must earn an NSDTRC Championship (USA), and any two of the following working titles from AKC: An Obedience Trial Championship (OTCH), Master Agility Championship (MACH), Champion Tracker (CT), or Master Hunter (MH). It is possible the award will not be presented every year.

This award is presented by John & Marie Simonson to the recipient to honor their dog's versatile accomplishments at the highest level and inspire others to train their dogs to the highest level in multiple venues. Eddy, their first Toller, is an exceptional working Toller whose successes in the Show Ring, Obedience, and Field prompted this award. Eddy is the first AKC registered Toller to earn the combination of AKC Champion, AKC Obedience Trial Champion, AKC Utility Dog Excellent 3, AKC Master Hunter, and NSDTRC (USA) Working Certificate Excellent. Eddy is known as CAN/AKC/NSDTRC(US) CH AKC OTCH CAN MOTCH Westerlea's Sir Edmund UDX4 OM1 MH US/ CAN WCX VCX ROMX (5/2001 - 8/2013).

In order to receive the Award at the 2017 Annual Banquet, titles will have to have been completed by June 30, 2017. No applications are necessary for this Award. Dogs eligible will be identified by NSDTRC Records.

Parklake Award

The Parklake Award is an award to honor the breeder(s) of the Best Stud Dog at each NSDTRC (USA) National Specialty. It is named in recognition of Parklake Kennels, and Jack and Peggy Park, The Parklake Award will be displayed at the 2017 Specialty Conformation Show, and awarded at the Annual Banquet. Code of Ethics
Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club (USA)
Approved 1996

1. I subscribe to the purpose of the NSDTRC (USA) as set forth in the Bylaws and will abide by the rules set down by the Club.
2. I will acquaint myself with the NSDTRC (USA) approved Breed Standard for the NSDTR (Toller), and with principles of good health and grooming for the breed.
3. I will exhibit sportsman like conduct that will reflect on me and on the breed at all competitions, and will encourage others to do so. I will refrain from public criticism and malicious degrading of others and their dogs.
4. I will ensure humane treatment, including proper feeding, maintenance, health care and training, for all my animals and will encourage other to do the same.
5. I will commit myself to continuing education in matters pertaining to the care and training of the Toller.
6. If I breed, I will strive to improve the Toller breed according to the NSDTRC Breed Standard. I will conscientiously plan each breeding, choosing only parents of appropriate temperament, appearance and other desirable qualities.
7. I will become aware of genetic defects that can be harmful to the breed. When breeding, I will endeavor to select animals that will reduce the incidence of genetic problems while enhancing the positive attributes and abilities of the breed. I will be open with all persons interested in the welfare of the Toller and will discuss possible physical or temperament defects in my own stock.
8. I will act responsibly in regards to all puppies produced by my breeding for the lifetime of the puppies.
9. I will never knowingly sell to, or place a Toller with unethical persons or those who would not provide proper and humane care to the dog. I will refuse to sell any Toller to any pet shop or to any wholesale dealer in dogs.
10. Should I become aware of the mistreatment, abuse, or need for relocation of any Toller, I will make every effort to be of assistance by notifying the breeder of the dog involved and the appropriate local authorities, and I will assist in any other manner in which I am able.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

Hotel Etiquette: Clean up after your dog!! Your dogs must be controlled at all times. No flexi-leads are to be used in and around the hotel for the safety of your dogs and other hotel guests.

The Show Committee has designated the entire hotel grounds and Agility/Field sites as the show site. An Event Committee hearing may be held for any hotel or other site complaint including but not limited to failure to clean up after your dog and destruction of hotel or other site property.

Exercise Areas: Please observe marked "No Dogs" areas around the hotel grounds. ALL Attendees are expected to clean up promptly after their dogs. Pooper Scoopers, bags and refuse cans will be provided at the Hotel and Other Sites.

The Club and Hotel shall not be liable for damage to motor vehicles in any effort to rescue a dog from overheating or suffocation due to inadequate ventilation.

The Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club reserves the right to substitute a prize with one of equal or greater value.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.

CANADIAN EXHIBITORS MUST SUBMIT ENTRIES WITH CHECKS DRAWN ON U.S. ACCOUNTS OR WITH INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDERS IN U.S. FUNDS.

A Recording Fee of 50 cents for each dog and an AKC Event Service Fee of \$3.00 will be required for each recordable single entry class at any Licensed or Member Club Show or Obedience Trial. (American Kennel Club Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2). A \$3.50 AKC Recording Fee will be required for the first entry in Rally and \$3.00 for each additional entry in Rally. (American Kennel Club Rally Regulation, Chapter 1, Section 5). A \$2.00 Event Service Fee will be required for each entry in 4-6 Month Beginner Puppy. These Fees are paid to the American Kennel Club.

RETURNED CHECKS / INVALID CREDIT CARDS do not constitute a valid entry. The Superintendent will add a collection fee of \$25 to the amount of each returned check and credit card. Subsequent returned checks and credit card from the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a cash-only basis. Entry Fee will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

No entry fees will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and or dangerous weather conditions, an Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club or the Superintendent.

No Refund for Duplicate Entries. Every effort to find all duplicate entries will be made; however, if entry has been processed, no refund will be made.

Refunds made for cancellation of entries before the closing date will be subject to a \$3.00 administrative/processing fee per entry.

No Entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Changes, additions or corrections to entry forms must be received in writing prior to close of entries. Those received by telephone are not acceptable.

Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging. Dogs must be ready for judging. Neither the club nor the Superintendent will be responsible or obligated to furnish any service for notifying exhibitors or their agents of Breed or Class judging.

Judges need not wait for any dog holding up the class. **Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings.**

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.

The show giving club, the Superintendent, their agents, employees, etc., assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers to any of their dogs or property, and further assume no responsibility for injury to children.

4. A dog must be entered in the name of the person who actually owned it at the time entries for an event closed.
