Best Veteran Competition

Is open to all first place winners of Veterans Classes as this class is judged after the Best of Breed Competition. Any entry in the Veterans classes that is awarded Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex would automatically be Best Veteran

Best of Breed Competition

Non-Regular Classes Involving Single Dog Entries

The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches

Working • Veteran

The Working Class is open to AKC registered Bloodhounds that have been awarded AKC Tracking Title or an ABC Trailing Title. A minimum of TD or MT, respectively is required to enter. Hounds competing in the Working Class will be exhibited in harness. First-Fourth placements will be offered in each sex. The two class winners compete in Best of Breed competition. In accordance with Chapter 11 of rules applying to Dog Shows, altered dogs or spayed bitches are ineligible to compete.

Veterans classes are open to dogs and bitches who are at least 7 years of age on the day of the event. Spayed or neutered Bloodhounds MAY be shown in Veteran Non-Regular Classes.

Please Note: If a dog is defeated in any class, they may NOT be shown in Best of Breed, even if entered in Best of Breed.

Non-Regular Classes Involving Multiple Dog Entries

STUD DOG CLASS – For Stud Dogs and at least two, but not more than three of their Get. Owner of Stud Dog need not necessarily be owner of Get. The Get **MUST** be entered and shown in one of the Regular Classes at this show. The Stud Dog is the **ONLY** dog to be listed on the entry form and must be shown in the ring with his Get. Awards will be based on the merits of the Get.

BROOD BITCH CLASS - same as for Stud Dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

BRACE CLASS– The Brace Class shall be for two dogs of at least one identical owner or co-owner regardless of sex. The two dogs comprising the Brace shall be considered a unit and they must be named at time of entry. If a dog, which is to be part of a brace is not entered in a regular class, or Best of Breed Competition, the dog must be entered for “Brace Class Only”. In making entries for Brace Class Only, full particulars must be given for each dog on individual regular entry forms. An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as a part of a brace, **MUST** be marked accordingly in the space provided for **ADDITIONAL CLASSES** – “Brace Class.” If more than one Brace is entered by the identical owner, the dogs comprising **EACH** brace must be designated, “Brace No. 1”, “Brace No. 2”, etc. Please submit Brace entries together.

NOTE: *As the judge’s decision in the Non-Regular Classes involving Multiple Dog Entries is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch. All multiple entry non-regular classes will be judged following Best of Breed.*

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

Novice Junior 9 & under 12 yrs • Open Junior 9 & under 12 yrs

Novice Intermediate 12 & under 15 yrs • Open Intermediate 12 & under 15 yrs

Novice Senior 15 & under 18 yrs • Open Senior 15 & under 18 yrs

Novice Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition, if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open, after the closing of entries for a show are required to transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class by notifying the Superintendent or Show Secretary at least one-half hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show.

Open Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show.

Master Class - for boys & girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to complete for the following year.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry.

You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department (919) 233-9767.

2017 REGIONAL SPECIALTY PUPPY/JUNIOR SWEEPSTAKES

The Sweepstakes is open to all Bloodhounds who, on the day of the show, will be at least 6 months of age and under 24 months of age and are either **owner or amateur handled**. Dogs shown in Sweepstakes **MUST** also be entered in one of the regular classes at the regular entry fee and on the regular entry form. Indicate your Sweepstakes Class with age division in the space provided for "Additional Class." First Place Winners of each Puppy Class shall compete for Best Puppy in Sweepstakes and Best of Opposite Sex to Best Puppy in Sweepstakes. First Place Winners of each Junior Class shall compete for Best Junior in Sweepstakes and Best of Opposite Sex to Best Junior in Sweepstakes. The Best Puppy and Best Junior shall compete for Grand Sweepstakes Winner. Champions of record are eligible to compete. **Puppy and Junior Sweepstakes will be judged AFTER Veteran Sweepstakes.**

Classifications

The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches.

- Puppy, 6 Mos & Under 9 Mos
- Puppy, 9 Mos & Under 12 Mos
- Junior, 12 Mos & Under 18 Mos
- Junior, 18 Mos & Under 24 Mos

Class Cash Prizes will be paid in the ring to the person showing the dog. Claims for prize money must be made in the ring before the judging of that breed is over and the Show Secretary advised at once. The Superintendent and show-giving Club disclaim any liability for cash prizes after the judging of the breed is over

DIVISION OF PUPPY SWEEPSTAKES MONIES

35% of the total entry fees will be retained by the Club for expenses. The remaining 65% will be divided as follows:

2017 REGIONAL SPECIALTY VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

The Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all Bloodhounds who, on the day of the show, will be at least 7 years of age or older and are either **owner or amateur handled**. Dogs shown in Veteran Sweepstakes need not be entered in one of the regular classes or at the regular entry fee. Indicate your Veteran Sweepstakes Class with the age division in the space provided. Entrants need not hold a Championship Title. Neutered or Spayed Bloodhounds may also be shown in the Veteran Sweepstakes. There will be no competition between the sexes. **Veterans will be judged BEFORE Puppy and Junior Sweepstakes.**

The Veteran Sweepstakes Judge will only award First Place in Each Class.

The First Place Winners in each class will compete for Best Veteran Dog and Best Veteran Bitch. Every Entrant shall receive a participatory rosette.

DIVISION OF VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES MONIES

35% of the total entry fees will be retained by the Club for expenses. The remaining 65% will be divided as follows:

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.

General Show Information

THE AMERICAN BLOODHOUND CLUB reserves the right to substitute a prize of equal or greater value.

ALL DOGS must be held on leash or confined to their crates except when being judged or when in the exercising pen.

NO SOFT-SIDED CRATES under the grooming tent; crates must be stacked; Ex-pens allowed only outside the grooming tent.

POP-UP TENTS will be allowed in designated areas only.

THERE SHALL BE NO drilling nor intensive or corrective training of dogs on the show grounds or premises.

NO FLEXI LEADS, No Halti-type collars, or pinch collars on the show grounds.

NO PRACTICING IN RINGS. DOGS ALLOWED in rings during judging only.

DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Clubs and the Event Secretary will not be responsible and are not obligated to furnish any service for notifying exhibitors or their agents of breed or class judging. Judges will not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging ring.

DOGS NEED TO BE AT THE SHOW only at scheduled time of judging and may leave immediately thereafter, unless required for further judging.

EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE for maintaining clean conditions in and around their crates/set-up.

AKC RULES STATE THAT ONLY DOGS THAT ARE ELIGIBLE to be shown under the American Kennel Club Rules shall be allowed within the show precincts.

EXHIBITORS SHOULD FOLLOW THEIR VETERINARIAN'S RECOMMENDATION to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

THE AMERICAN BLOODHOUND CLUB and the Superintendent/Event Secretary are not responsible for the actions or products of the commercial vendors at these events.

THE WELFARE OF AN EXHIBITOR'S CHILD is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children on the days of the shows.

The exhibitor is also responsible for any damage done by the exhibitor's child.

(American Kennel Club Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2). A \$3.50 AKC Recording Fee will be required for the first entry in Rally and \$3.00 for each additional entry in Rally. (American Kennel Club Rally Regulation, Chapter 1, Section 5). A \$2.00 Event Service Fee will be required for each entry in 4-6 Month Beginner Puppy. These Fees are paid to the American Kennel Club.

RETURNED CHECKS / INVALID CREDIT CARDS do not constitute a valid entry. The Superintendent will add a collection fee of \$25 to the amount of each returned check and credit card. Subsequent returned checks and credit card from the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a cash-only basis.
