The Pheasant Run Resort is the host hotel for the 2019 BTCA National Specialty. The room rate is \$114.00 per night, with a maximum of four dogs and four people per room. There is a \$50.00 one time, non-refundable pet fee for rooms with dogs.

If a reservation is cancelled at least 48 hours prior to the arrival date, an attendee's credit card will not be charged and any deposit made by an attendee will be refunded. If a reservation is not cancelled at least 48 hours prior to the arrival date, one night's accommodation (plus applicable state and city taxes in effect at the time) will be charged. Guaranteed reservations are cancelled, and one night's accommodation (plus applicable state and city taxes in effect at the time) will be charged, if an attendee does not arrive on the first night.

The resort is west of Chicago, between I-88 and I-90 on Route 64. It is 40 minutes from O'Hare International Airport and convenient to shopping and restaurants. Reservations are open. Call 630-584-6300 by May 17, 2019 and identify yourself as a BTCA specialty attendee to receive our rate and block of rooms.

BORDER TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA, INC. ROOM RESPONSIBILITY POLICY

The Border Terrier Club of America, Inc. has adopted the following rules in order to ensure that its members and their dogs will be welcome at hotels in the future.

Any individual attending a BTCA sanctioned event and staying in a hotel, motel, inn, or campsite/fairground has the responsibility of leaving that room or campsite exactly as found. This includes picking up after dog(s) on the grounds. Anyone who damages a room or campsite/fairground and does not report the damage to the hotel/motel/campsite/fairground management and make immediate restitution or arrangements to do so within a period of time agreed upon by the management, will be subject to any or all of the following actions by the BTCA Board of Directors.

1. May be banned from showing at the next BTCA sanctioned events(s).
2. May be subject to AKC sanctions.
3. Membership in the BTCA may be terminated and may not be allowed to be reinstated.

Damages shall be defined as:

1. Flea infestation, urine, defecation and/or any damage to hotel/motel/campsite/fairground property (walls, bedspreads, carpets, drapes, etc.)
2. Any verified complaint by the host/hotel/campsite/fairground.
3. Any verified complaint by a BTCA member.

BTCA Room Regulations:

1. All dogs shall be crated and quiet when left alone in a room. Noisy dogs shall be quieted upon request, even if this means the owner/handler must stay in the room with the dog.
2. Individuals will be expected to immediately report any damage by dogs or themselves to the hotel/campsite/fairground management and to assume complete financial responsibility for those damages.
3. No bathing or grooming of dogs will be allowed in rooms. A grooming room will be available whenever possible.
4. Dogs are allowed to be on hotel furniture/beds ONLY if the furniture is covered with protective covering provided by the owner/handler.
5. All owner/handlers will take preventative measures to assure that their dogs are free of fleas, mites, intestinal parasites, and other communicable diseases prior to arriving at the hotel/campsite.

DOG EXERCISE OPTIONS

Please respect the common areas off the lobby where there are flowers and where guests enter and leave the hotel and show site. There are no dogs allowed on the golf course. If your dog has an accident in the hotel, please clean it up immediately. If you need assistance, please ask for it.

PHEASANT RUN RESORT, 4051 E. Main Street, St Charles, IL 60147

RV parking is available in a lot immediately east of the building, which will host the Specialty's indoor activities. There is no electric or sanitary available. Limited water hook-up is available but could be as much as 200 feet from your camper. The parking lot has no assigned Handicap permit parking for campers, but campers with a state assigned Handicap parking permit will be assigned spaces closer to the building. If you have a Handicap Permit, please enclose a copy of it with your reservation.

The cost for parking from the night of June 9 until the day of June 15 is \$150, which includes one sanitary pump-out. There is no pro-rating of camping fees. Space is available for 30 RVs. RV sites are 25 feet wide and 50 feet long. If you need more space, please reserve two spaces. Except for handicap permits, all other spaces are on a "first come, first serve" basis.

Because there is no electricity, it is likely generators will be used extensively. In order to keep pollution to a minimum, please make sure your generator exhaust has an extension on it. Please use generators overnight only when necessary to keep noise down as much as possible. You can purchase a spa/shower/swimming pass directly from the resort for \$45 per camping unit upon arrival.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. Dogs found in an unsafe environment, distress, or harm's way (for example: left unattended on a grooming table in a noose not attached to a safety release clip; left in a vehicle without proper ventilation) will be removed to safety. Exposing a dog to an unsafe environment, distress, or harm's way is considered mistreatment. All persons attending this show hereby waive any claim for damages against the host clubs in the event a motor vehicle has to be entered to rescue a dog from overheating or improperly vented conditions. **Note: Flexi leashes are prohibited on show grounds.**

- The show site will be available to exhibitors from Monday, June 10, 2019 after 6:30pm. The site will then be available from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 pm on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Dogs must be removed from the building immediately following the conclusion of judging on Friday, June 14, 2019.

- There shall be no drilling nor intensive or abusive training of dogs on the show grounds.
- The club reserves the right to remove any animal in distress from a parked vehicle or crate in any way necessary. The club solely determines if said animal is in distress. All persons attending this dog show hereby waive any claim for damages against the club for such removal.
- Please, no baby strollers in the show building.
- The grooming area will be located on the south side of the MegaCenter.
- Exhibitors must load/unload through the east overhead doors of the MegaCenter. No loading/unloading is permitted through the front doors or west glass doors.
- Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining clean conditions around their grooming areas.
- **Exhibitors are required to clean up after the dogs they are exhibiting or which are under their care or control. This requirement includes both while in the ring or at any location on the show site. Clean up tools and supplies will be available at each ring and at other convenient locations.**

Non-Regular Classes (Additional) Involving Multiple Dog Entries

NOTE: *As the judges' decision in the Non-Regular Classes Involving Multiple Dog Entries is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in this class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class.*

Chapter 11, Section 8 of the Dog Show Rules provides that a "castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class."

STUD DOG CLASS: For Stud Dogs and TWO of their Get. The Stud Dog must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with its Get. Get MUST be entered in another Class. The owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be the owner of the Get. Only the Get is to be judged based on their merits, while the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry. Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show rules, AKC policy, or the Standard for its breed.

BROOD BITCH CLASS: Same as for the Stud Dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Prodeu for Get.

BRACE CLASS: Two dogs of the same breed and must have at least one common owner and presented by a maximum of two handlers. The dogs comprising a brace must be named at time of entry. Dogs must also be entered in a regular or non-regular conformation class. Champions of Record and altered dogs may be entered. "Brace" must be marked accordingly in the space provided for Additional Classes, "Brace Class." If more than one Brace is entered by the same owner, the dogs comprising EACH Brace must be so designated, "Brace No 1," "Brace No 2." Etc.

TEAM CLASS: Same as Brace, except substitute Team for Brace and four dogs and handlers for two.

BREEDERS CLASS: The Breeders Class is a multiple entry class consisting of 3-5 dogs regardless of sex. This class is open to all breeders. All dogs entered must have at least one breeder in common who must be present. The individual dogs comprising the entry must be from at least two different combinations of parents, but need not be owned or handled by the breeder. Entrants must be entered individually in some other conformation class. Each dog must be entered on a separate entry form and all forms submitted together.

Best Bred By Exhibitor, Best Veteran, Best Working

First place in each Bred By Exhibitor class will compete for Best Bred By Exhibitor. If the BBE class winner is Best of Breed or Best of Winners, that BBE dog/bitch will automatically win Best Bred By Exhibitor.

First place in each Veteran class will first compete for Best Veteran. If a Veteran wins Best of Breed, it will automatically win Best Veteran.

Winners of the Working Dog and Working Bitch classes compete for Best Working. If a Working winner wins Best of Breed, it automatically wins Best Working.

Best Otter Head

Best Otter Head is open to all conformation and performance entries at the Specialty. The judge will select that entry whose head best fits the breed standard. There is no entry fee for this competition. It is not necessary to sign up for Best Otter Head as a separate class.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

Novice Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition, if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open, after the closing of entries for a show are required to transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class by notifying the Superintendent or Show Secretary prior to the judging of the class at the show.

Open Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who have won three (3) first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show.

Master Class - will be for boys & girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and must change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

No entry may be changed or cancelled unless notice of the change or cancellation is received in writing by the Superintendent or Show Secretary named in the premium list to receive entries, prior to the closing date and hour for entries, except that a correction may be made from one age division to another, as well as, move from Master to Open or Open to Novice if a win has been disallowed or the Junior miscalculated number of placements, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent or Show Secretary prior to the judging of the class at the show.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department (919) 233-9767.

CANADIAN EXHIBITORS MUST SUBMIT ENTRIES WITH CHECKS DRAWN ON U.S. ACCOUNTS OR WITH INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDERS IN U.S. FUNDS.

A Recording Fee of 50 cents for each dog and an AKC Event Service Fee of \$3.00 will be required for each recordable single entry class at any Licensed or Member Club Show or Obedience Trial. (American Kennel Club Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2). A \$3.50 AKC Recording Fee will be required for the first entry in Rally and \$3.00 for each additional entry in Rally. (American Kennel Club Rally Regulation, Chapter 1, Section 5). A \$2.00 Event Service Fee will be required for each entry in 4-6 Month Beginner Puppy. These Fees are paid to the American Kennel Club.

RETURNED CHECKS / INVALID CREDIT CARDS do not constitute a valid entry. The Superintendent will add a collection fee of \$25 to the amount of each returned check and credit card. Subsequent returned checks and credit card from the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a cash-only basis.
