Bred By Exhibitor Puppy class winners will be eligible to compete for Best Puppy

AMATEUR OWNER HANDLER CLASS - For dogs at least six months of age that are not champions and are handled by an eligible owner. Professional handlers, AKC-approved conformation judges, assistants to professional handlers, and members of their household are not eligible.

Class eligibility and competition will be governed by current AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows, Chapter 3, Section 7.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS ELIGIBILITY - For dogs six months of age or older, not champions on the date of closing, individually registered with the AKC, and owned or co-owned by a breeder of record. The dog must be handled in this class by a breeder of record and owner of record of the dog.

Classes are divided into Puppy and Adult divisions.

Class eligibility and competition will be governed by current AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows, Chapter 3, Section 8.

AKC NATIONAL OWNER-HANDLED SERIES - The AKC National Owner-Handled Series is a non-titling competition for dogs exhibited by eligible owner-handlers.

Eligible exhibitors must indicate NOHS participation at the time of entry.

Owner-Handled Best of Breed will be selected following Best of Breed judging in accordance with current AKC NOHS rules and procedures.

Eligibility and competition will be governed by current AKC National Owner-Handled Series regulations.

Non-Regular Classes Involving Single Dog Entries
Both Great Dane Club of America & Great Dane Club of Middle TN Specialties

The following non-regular classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches
The following Veteran classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches:

Veterans 6 Years and Under 8 Years

Veterans 8 Years and Older

First place winners in the Veteran Dog and Veteran Bitch classes, if otherwise undefeated at this show, are eligible to compete for Best of Breed competition.

Neutered dogs and spayed bitches may be entered in Veteran Classes.

Competition and eligibility will be governed by current AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows, including Chapter 3, Sections 12 & 13, and Chapter 6, Section 2.

Non-Regular Classes Involving Multiple Dog Entries Great Dane Club of America Specialty only

As the judge's decision in the Non-Regular Classes involving Multiple Dog Entries is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no dog or bitch comprising an entry awarded first in these classes shall be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won the class.

STUD DOG CLASS

For Stud Dogs and two to four of their Get. The Stud Dog may be entered separately in one of the regular classes or, if a Champion of Record, in Best of Breed Competition. The Get must be entered in one of the regular classes.

The Stud Dog must be shown in the ring with the Get. The class will be judged on the merits of the Get.

BROOD BITCH CLASS

Same as the Stud Dog Class, except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

Novice Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition, if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open, after the closing of entries for a show are required to transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class by notifying the Superintendent or Show Secretary prior to the judging of the class at the show.

Open Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who have won three (3) first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show.

Master Class - will be for boys & girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and must change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

No entry may be changed or cancelled unless notice of the change or cancellation is received in writing by the Superintendent or Show Secretary named in the premium list to receive entries, prior to the closing date and hour for entries, except that a correction may be made from one age division to another, as well as, move from Master to Open or Open to Novice if a win has been disallowed or the Junior miscalculated number of placements, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent or Show Secretary prior to the judging of the class at the show.

This discussion will encompass juvenile orthopedic diseases such as osteochondritis dissecans (OCD), hip dysplasia (briefly as it has its own talk), elbow dysplasia (disease pathogenesis, genetics, monitoring for breeding stock, treatment), panosteitis, retained cartilage cores, hypertrophic osteodystrophy (HOD), and Wobbler's. The discussion will focus on genetics, diet, exercise, disease presentations, treatment options geared towards lay people.

CRATING & GROOMING POLICY

All crating, grooming setups, exercise pens, and exhibitor spaces are subject to the direction and approval of the Grounds Committee.

NO SOFT-SIDED CRATES WILL BE PERMITTED IN ANY CRATING AREA, GROOMING AREA, DAY CRATING AREA, RINGSIDE AREA, OR SHOW AREA DURING THE 2026 GDCA NATIONAL SPECIALTY.

This policy applies to:

ringside crating, day crating, grooming areas, show ring areas, rally & obedience ring areas, and all other indoor exhibit areas

Soft-sided crates **may not** be used in hotel sleeping rooms and are **prohibited** by local hotel policy.

No crates, grooming tables, exercise pens, or exhibitor setups will be permitted in aisles, entrances, exits, or other restricted areas. All grooming must be done only in designated grooming areas.

All crating and exercise pen placement will be at the discretion of the Grounds Committee. The Club reserves the right to require adjustment, relocation, or removal of any setup deemed unsafe, obstructive, excessive, or not in compliance with National Specialty rules.

Dogs may not be left unattended in exercise pens or grooming areas.

All dogs present on the show grounds must be held on leash or confined in an approved crate or exercise pen except when being judged.

An owner-supplied floor covering must be used under all crates.

Dog owners and handlers are responsible for maintaining clean crating and grooming areas and for prompt cleanup after their dogs.

Crates are permitted only in designated areas.

Dogs must be crated when left alone in hotel rooms.

WE ALSO OFFER A SEPARATE, QUIET DAY CRATING AREA FOR EXHIBITORS DOGS.

Failure to comply with crating and grooming policies may result in removal of equipment and/or an Event Committee hearing.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

Trophies and Prizes will be awarded in the judging ring. All trophies and prizes must be claimed on the day of the show. None will be mailed. The Club reserves the right to substitute an unavailable prize with one of equal or greater value.

Exhibitors are advised to make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club referred to on the reverse side of the entry blanks that accompany this premium list. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this show is in the care and custody of his owner or handler the entire time the dog is in the show buildings, on the show premises, or any hotel associated with the show.

Dog owners and/or handlers are responsible for any damage to hotel property caused by their dogs. This applies to the Founder's Inn & Spa property and all other hotels used for this specialty. No gasoline or diesel generators are permitted inside any building or within 100 feet of any tent in which this dog show is conducted.

The welfare of any child is the responsibility of its parent(s). It is expressly understood that parents will exercise control and restraint over their children throughout the event.

NO DOGS ALLOWED IN HOTEL LOBBY, DINING AREAS, POOL.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.

CANADIAN EXHIBITORS MUST SUBMIT ENTRIES WITH CHECKS DRAWN ON U.S. ACCOUNTS OR WITH INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDERS IN U.S. FUNDS.

An AKC Event Fee of \$4.50 will be required for each entry in an event. There is no Event Fee for Junior Showmanship, Sweepstakes, Brace/Team, Multi-Dog Classes, or Special Attractions. A \$3.00 Event Fee will be required for each entry in 4-6 Month Beginner Puppy and each entry in FSS Open Shows. These Fees are paid to the American Kennel Club.

RETURNED CHECKS / INVALID CREDIT CARDS do not constitute a valid entry. The Superintendent will add a collection fee of \$25 to the amount of each returned check and credit card. Subsequent returned checks and credit card from the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a cash-only basis.
