NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING SINGLE DOG ENTRIES

(The winners of these classes, if otherwise undefeated, will compete for Best of Breed)

Veteran 7-9 Classes - A class for dogs and a class for bitches seven (7) years of age or older on the day of the show and less than nine (9) years of age.

Veteran 9-11 Classes - A class for dogs and a class for bitches nine (9) years of age or older on the day of the show and less than eleven (11) years of age.

Veteran 11 and Over Classes - A class for dogs and a class for bitches eleven (11) years of age and over.

Chapter 11, Section 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that castrated dogs and spayed bitches **may** be entered in Veteran Classes at a Specialty that does not offer classes beyond Best of Breed. **Only first place will be awarded in the Veteran dogs & Veteran bitches classes.**

Herding Titled Classes - A class for dogs and a class for bitches for any Pembroke Welsh Corgi over six (6) months of age that has acquired an AKC herding title of record is eligible for this class. Neutered dogs & spayed bitches **may** compete. **Only first place will be awarded in the Herding Titled Dog and Herding Titled Bitch Classes.**

NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES
(The Winners of these Classes will NOT be eligible to compete for Best of Breed)

Stud Dog Class. For Stud Dogs with two of their Get. Stud Dogs must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with their Get. Owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be the owner of the Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under Dog Show Rules, AKC policy or the standard of the breed. Get must be entered in a Regular Class, Best of Breed or another Non-Regular Class.

Brood Bitch Class. For Brood Bitches with two of their Produce. Brood Bitches must be entered in the Brood Bitch Class and must be shown in the ring with their Produce. Owner of the Brood Bitch need not necessarily be the owner of the Produce. While the merits of the Brood Bitch are not to be considered in the placement of the entry the Brood Bitch must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under Dog Show Rules, AKC policy or the standard of the breed. Produce must be entered in a Regular Class, Best of Breed or another Non-Regular Class.

NOTE: As the judge's decision in the Stud Dog and Brood Bitch Classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, not one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes. Chapter 11, Section 8 of the *"Rules Applying to Dog Shows"* provides that "a castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class."

4-6 MONTH BEGINNER PUPPY COMPETITION

Section 1 - Classifications

The Four-to-Six Month Puppy competition shall be for dogs that are four months of age and over but under six months on the day of the event. Classes will be offered for breeds and varieties and divided into Groups as described in Chapter 3, Section 1 of the *Rules Applying to Dog Shows* and the Miscellaneous Class breeds as listed in Chapter 3, Section 23. The Miscellaneous class competition will be the equivalent of Group competition, and the winner will be eligible to compete in Best Four-to-Six Month Puppy in Show. The FSS competition will be the equivalent of Group competition and the winner will be eligible to compete in Best Four-to-Six Month Puppy in Show.

Section 2 - Entry and Eligibility

Entry and eligibility requirements include:

- The Four-to-Six Month (Beginner Puppy) Competition must be listed in the premium list, entry form and judging schedule, if offered.
- Closing date and time for this competition may be listed as any date and time prior to the event including the same day as the event and must be listed in the premium list, entry form and judging schedule.
- AKC registration number or an AKC litter number will be required for entries of an AKC recognized breed as listed in Chapter 3, Section 1 of the *Rules Applying to Dog Shows*.
- A foreign-born dog may enter this class if they are registered in the country of origin.
- FSS number or FSS registered litter number will be required for Miscellaneous and FSS breed entries.
- All entrants are to be vaccinated (including rabies) in accordance with their veterinarian's protocol.
- Professional handlers, members of their household and current assistants to professional handlers may personally exhibit a dog they own as "Exhibition Only" in the Four-to-Six Month (Beginner Puppy) Competition. "Exhibition Only" entries are not eligible to earn awards in this competition.
- Dogs that are owned or co-owned by a professional handler, members of their household or current assistants to professional handlers may compete for awards in this competition but must be handled by a non-professional handler. *Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years. Dogs may not be exhibited by current assistants and household members of a professional handler.*
- Minors (under 18) with amateur status who reside with professional handlers and current assistants to professional handlers that are eligible to compete in Junior Showmanship (meet age and amateur status requirements) may personally exhibit dogs in the Four-to-Six Month (Beginner Puppy) Competition.
- A change to modify an entry to Exhibition Only or from Exhibition Only to be eligible to compete for awards may not be made after closing.

The Pee Wee Special Attraction is a pre-Junior Showmanship class. The Pee Wee class is geared toward children 5 to under 9 years of age at all shows offering Pee Wee. Each Pee Wee unit consists of the child, his/her parent/guardian/responsible adult, and the dog. Only one Pee Wee unit is in the ring at a time. This is not a competitive class, but rather a fun, learning experience for the child and the adult.

1. A dog must be at least four months of age to enter the Pee Wee class
2. Bitches in season will not be allowed to participate. If pre-entered, a dog may be substituted that meets the eligibility requirements as specified by the club
3. All dogs entered must have the proper lead and collar.
4. A responsible adult must be present with the child both inside and outside the ring.
The adult is to maintain control of the dog outside of the ring.
5. In addition to an entry, a release must be signed by the child's parent or legal guardian.
Release forms will be available at the show.

The safety of both the dogs and Juniors inside and outside the ring is a primary concern. Outside of the ring, the dog is to be controlled by the adult accompanying the child. An additional lead, provided by the Club, will be at the Judge's table. At the Judge's discretion based upon the size of the child and the dog, for safety purposes the adult may be asked to attach a second lead to the dog so both child and adult will walk the dog together.

Although the word "judge" will be used, this is designed to be a learning and mentoring experience - no Junior will be "judged" but rather will be mentored with the age appropriate amount of information to help prepare them for what they will be expected to know about AKC regular Junior Showmanship once they reach 9 years of age. The children will be mentored one child, their adult, and dog in the ring at a time. Each child will receive a participation **Rosette** to commemorate the experience

The Judge should explain the process of showing the dog to the Junior and the responsible adult in the ring including breed specific presentation. Depending on the size of the dog and the child, the adult may be asked to lift a table breed on or off the table, or the Club may mandate that the adult should do it regardless. Neither the youngster nor the adult should be asked to show the bite.

Entries close at the Superintendent's Office, 6:00 pm, **CST, September 16, 2026** or when the numerical limit is reached.

Novice Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition, if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open, after the closing of entries for a show are required to transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class by notifying the Superintendent or Show Secretary prior to the judging of the class at the show.

Open Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who have won three (3) first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show.

Master Class - will be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and must change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

No entry may be changed or cancelled unless notice of the change or cancellation is received in writing by the Superintendent or Show Secretary named in the premium list to receive entries, prior to the closing date and hour for entries, except that a correction may be made from one age division to another, as well as, move from Master to Open or Open to Novice if a win has been disallowed or the Junior miscalculated number of placements, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent or Show Secretary prior to the judging of the class at the show.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry.

You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department (919) 233-9767.

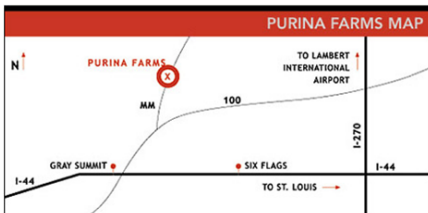

2026 TRIATHLON CHALLENGE

The Triathlon Challenge is a competition to honor the Most Versatile Pembroke at the 2026 National Specialty. Corgi fanciers must pre-register by September 16th, 2026 to participate.

Be aware that not all points listed in this document may be available during specific year's competition. This document lists points available for all AKC classes offered, and the PWCCA may decline to offer the entire roster of potential classes.

COMPETITION RULES

To be eligible, a dog must enter and compete in at least three (3) event categories offered at the National Specialty: herding, agility, obedience, rally and conformation (including sweepstakes and altered class). Any combination of these categories is acceptable. If entered in more than three categories, the top three highest scores earned will be used toward the challenge (except when it comes to breaking any tie score). More than one person throughout the competition may handle the dog.

Dogs participating in these events, even if they do not qualify, earn points. Points, however, are not earned by dogs that are excused for lameness or unacceptable behavior as defined by the rules of that particular event.

Points are awarded for whatever class or combination of classes that earns a dog the most points in each of the events. Three points are awarded for competing in an event. Additional points are awarded for qualifying, or earning a placement ribbon in a conformation class. Some events award additional points for earning a score that is higher than the minimum required to qualify. Some events reward consistency with additional points for qualifying more than once. Some do both. The maximum number of points that may be earned from any event is 20.

All scoring for the top award will be done from the official Judge's book(s) for each event in order to verify the corgi has met the participation requirements (i.e., was not excused). Any errors in scoring **MUST** be reported within 24 hours of the posting of results for that event. If not reported then the score stands.

The dog earning the highest number of points during National Specialty week is the winner of the Triathlon Challenge. Winner of the competition will be announced, and an award presented, at the banquet on Saturday.

NOTE

1. The Triathlon Coordinator, or their designee, maintains all the records for this competition, and is responsible for gathering and recording scores as they are earned by participants.
2. All decisions by the Triathlon Coordinator and/or the National Specialty Performance Coordinator are final.

ENTRIES

Go to the current year's National Specialty page for rules, point schedule and a registration form. Entrants need to return the completed form and applicable fees to the Triathlon Committee by the deadline as identified on the registration form.

Most conformation events will add points to a triathlon score. These include Altered Class, Puppy Sweepstakes, Veteran Sweepstakes and the regular/BOB classes. Junior Showmanship, Team, Brace, Stud Dog and Brood Bitch classes do not count towards Triathlon scores.

The highest points earned in any one of these conformation events count toward the Triathlon score.

Points are awarded based on the number of dogs defeated in competition, since dogs entered in conformation do not receive scores. There must be at least one dog defeated in order to earn more than 3 points in conformation. Dogs defeated are determined by the number of dogs entered and shown in a class, not including any dogs excused or disqualified. The maximum number of points awarded to a class dog for any given class is 12.

In classes where ribbons are awarded to fourth place: a win earns the points listed below; second place earns one fewer point, third place earns 2 fewer points, and fourth place earns 3 fewer points, as long as at least one additional dog is defeated.

In classes where only a first place is awarded (e.g. Herding Titled) a win earns the points as below, as long as at least one other dog is defeated.

In classes where dogs are awarded Best and Best Opposite: the Best dog is considered to have defeated all the other dogs in that class, and the Best Opposite is considered to have defeated all other dogs of that sex only (as long as at least one dog was defeated) and points awarded as below.

For class dogs advancing to Winners, Reserve Winners or higher; class points are dropped and the dog is awarded the number of points indicated below. This also applies to Sweeps. Points are not cumulative.

TIE BREAKER

In the event of a tie score, the following criteria shall be used:

1. Points earned in all events (above the three used for the initial calculation) are included in the score.
2. If a tie still exists, or no Corgis competed in more than three (3) events, bonus points will be added to the tied scores based on level of competition in each event the Corgi participated in. The highest class competed in will be used, regardless if that score was used in the original calculation.
3. If a tie exists after step 2, a drawing of identical tokens with one uniquely marked will determine the winner.

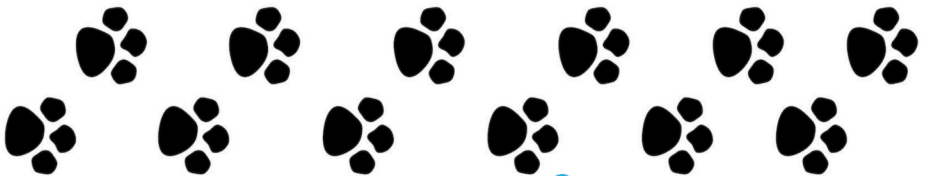

Preface: The tradition of competitive purebred dog events predates 1884—the year the American Kennel Club (AKC®) was founded. Those involved in these sports share core values, including a strong commitment to sportsmanship and a welcoming, respectful culture that embraces the diverse community united by a love of dogs.

These values are evident across all aspects of the sport: conformation, performance, companion, and family dog activities. Many believe that the enduring principles of sportsmanship and civility are key reasons the sport has thrived for over 140 years.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.

CANADIAN EXHIBITORS MUST SUBMIT ENTRIES WITH CHECKS DRAWN ON U.S. ACCOUNTS OR WITH INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDERS IN U.S. FUNDS.

An AKC Event Fee of \$4.50 will be required for each entry in an event. There is no Event Fee for Junior Showmanship, Sweepstakes, Brace/Team, Multi-Dog Classes, or Special Attractions. A \$3.00 Event Fee will be required for each entry in 4-6 Month Beginner Puppy and each entry in FSS Open Shows. These Fees are paid to the American Kennel Club.

RETURNED CHECKS / INVALID CREDIT CARDS do not constitute a valid entry. The Superintendent will add a collection fee of \$25 to the amount of each returned check and credit card. Subsequent returned checks and credit card from the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a cash-only basis.

Entry Fee will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

No entry fees will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and or dangerous weather conditions, an Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club or the Superintendent.

No Refund for Duplicate Entries. Every effort to find all duplicate entries will be made; however, if entry has been processed, no refund will be made.

Refunds made for cancellation of entries before the closing date will be subject to a \$3.00 administrative/processing fee per entry.

No Entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Changes, additions or corrections to entry forms must be received in writing prior to close of entries. Those received by telephone are not acceptable.
